The Career Pathways and Public Service Initiative is part of the greater Civic Literacy Excellence Initiative launched by Governor DeSantis in July 2021. The goal of the initiative is to create Civics Career Academies in local high schools to create a stackable pathway for students to work in the public sector.



### Civics Career Academies



Polk State College | Broward College Florida State College at Jacksonville

#### Overview:

- Polk State College received \$6.5 million and is distributing a portion of that grant to two subrecipients, Broward College, and Florida State College at Jacksonville.
- PSC has contracted with the Lou Frey Institute (LFI) at UCF to develop the curriculum for Civics Career Academies
- Curriculum is to be implemented in the 2023-2024 school year and follows a cohort approach
- 4 courses, each course is 1 semester and .5
  credit. Classes can be taken in 2 years or over 4
  years, based on school need.
  - Public Service Leadership
  - Public Service Careers and Communication
  - Public Service Project Management & Experiential Learning
  - Public Service Research Seminar





#### **Progress:**

- Partnered with Lou Frey to create a curriculum framework for the Civics Career Academies that will be available for high schools statewide upon final approval by FDOE
- Civics Leadership Academy summer camps for middle school students beginning June/July of 2023
- Recruited 24 schools, approximately 1000 students, across 4 districts
- Public servant interest and support (mayors, legislators, superintendent, etc.)
- Professional learning trips for students and teachers
- Scholarship opportunities for students
- Presentation at Social Studies and CTE Conferences





## Essential aspects of deliberative discussion

- Diverse perspectives
- A framed issue focus on values, tradeoffs, not facts
- Facilitator
  - Establishes atmosphere conducive to listening, sharing
  - Keeps to the options and surfaces values
